<u>Our members are AWESOME!!!</u> On September 23,2016, Lolita Kiorpes, biology and environmental science teacher at North Point High School and EACC member, was honored with a citation by the Charles County Commissioners today for her environmental work with students and getting NPHS recognized as the first NOAA Ocean Guardian School in Maryland.

Lolita is the recipient of the 2016 Presidential Innovation award for environmental educators. Maryland has had only 1 winner in the last 6 years (and an honorable mention). Only 11 teachers in the nation received this award. Her students are involved and super excited about the next steps!

On October 1st, we began the fall session of our <u>Professional Development workshop</u> <u>called "Creative Discipline"</u> again this fall, which is open to both members and nonmembers (for a small fee). This 3rd session of the class still carries 1 CPD credit with it, and includes a component investigating Restorative Practices during one of our two Saturday sessions. EACC had a team of 5 attend selected by NEA to attend a training on the **Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Implementation** in Rockville, MD September 22-25. shaping the education-policy decisions and explored possible implementation strategies for ESSA.
