Recap of past events:

Pre-tests were pushed back to the second week of school rather than being done during the first week of school. All pre-test data was loaded into Fast Test at a much faster rate than last year. The data was in Fast Test on/before October 9th to help with production of **SLOs**, but are also there to help guide instruction. CCPS worked hard to make this happen because of concerns brought forward by the EACC and its members.

Building visits: Since the end of September, we've been to: BOE, Westlake, Davis, and Stethem. We have plans to visit Neal, Stone, and Somers in the next month. We will let you know, in advance, when we will be visiting your school!

FYI: When we visit schools, we typically set up in the teachers' lounge and have snacks and give-aways for members and potential members who come visit us. We also have information about money saving opportunities available to members through NEA Member Benefits.

We come to visit you so that you may ask us questions directly, so that that we can provide you with updates on EACC activities, and so that you can voice your concerns. NEA Primary endorsement for Hillary Clinton: on October 3rd, the NEA Board of Directors voted to endorse Hillary Clinton for the Primary Elections. This was done following the protocols set forward for primary endorsements set forth in the NEA bylaws. NEA felt that an early endorsement would make us more relevant to the Clinton campaign, and Hillary Clinton has said that she wants educators involved her decision-making process. Our endorsement process is non-partisan. All candidates are invited for an interview with the NEA if they are seeking endorsement from the NEA. The Association interviews them and checks their background on voting history and stances on issues. We are most interested in those candidates who have proven to be education-friendly.

Mary Finneran, Vice Principal at Dr. Brown Elementary School, is the **new Unit II Representative on the EACC Executive Board.** Unit II members should feel free to take their EACC concerns and questions to Ms. Finneran, who will then bring them to the EACC Executive Board.

The District 27A Delegate Vacancy was filled by Suzie Proctor. As many of you may already know, Delegate Proctor passed away last month, leaving his position in the House vacant. The Charles County Democratic Central Committee held a lively public forum where candidates were given the chance to speak and answer questions about filling his seat. The CCDC voted to endorse Suzie Proctor to fulfill the rest of her late husband's term of office. The Governor appointed Mrs. Proctor to fill the seat.

The **MSEA Representative Assembly and Convention** was October 16-17 in Ocean City, Maryland. We had **31 SUPER EACC delegates** to the convention. We had a number of first time delegates to the convention; all of whom were attentive and active during the RA. Joe McMahan, EACC Vice President and teacher at Dr. Brown ES, was the co-chair of the MSEA By-Laws Committee and did a tremendous amount of work in the months leading up to the Convention to get the MSEA by-law amendments ready to be reviewed and acted upon by the MSEA Representative Assembly. Traci Davis, Diggs ES, put in a New Business Item (NBI) about MSEA continuing to research and gather data about the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment that was passed by an overwhelming majority. Alexis Eaton, Craik ES, and Christine Prozik, Gwynn Center, helped strategize on the Representative Assembly floor by moving to close debate at just the right time. Kathy Reamy, La Plata HS, was one of the winners in the MSEA App-tivist contest. Debbie Haan, Middleton ES, was our extremely awesome Political Action Campaign (PAC) captain. It was because of Debbie's hard work and the EACC delegates' donations that we were one of only a few locals to have 100% PAC participation and a **GOLD STAR!!!!!!!**
