Recap of past events:

Building visits: Recently we have visited Neal and Stone, with Ryon and Somers visits soon. We will let you know, in advance, when we will be visiting your school!

Annapolis News Conference- On Monday, November 2nd, Maryland lawmakers, parents, teachers and students joined at a news conference in Annapolis, once again calling upon Governor Hogan to release the \$68 million in GCEI funding that he held back from schools. Linda McLaughlin, Laura Duffy and Heather Hartman-Jansen were there, representing teachers in Charles County.

Lawmakers showed that the state's "structural deficit" has been closed, and there are enough surplus funds to add to pensions and restore the GCEI funding to schools. Yet again the governor has said no; giving possible future structural deficits and pension liabilities as his reasons. We were hopeful and felt the news conference was purposeful, but were not successful in convincing Governor Hogan.

Commissioner Amanda Stewart's Fundraiser- On November 7, 2015, Amanda Stewart had a fundraiser at The Prime Street Grille. Veronica McFadden and Cazie Pitts represented EACC at the fundraiser. We appreciate Amanda's hard work and continuing support.

Ruth Ann Hall Champion Student Recognition for middle school students:

The Ruth Ann Hall Champion Student Recognition was established by the EACC as a memorial to Ruth Ann Hall. Ms. Hall was a middle school teacher in Charles County for over twenty years, a former EACC President, and a passionate advocate for children and public education. In her memory, EACC established this award for middle school students in 2001.

The selection process will be simple:

- Nominations for the award will open in December. **Deadline for recommendations is January 29, 2016.**
- A teacher or a team of teachers may nominate a student by completing a brief nominations form.
- Members of the EACC Public Relations Committee will review the nominations forms and decide on the recipients of the recognition. We ask that you recognize a student/s who has shown improvement in areas such as attendance, good citizenship, excellent effort or other related academic reasons. This award is not intended for those students who already do well in school and who most likely receive other types of recognition. This is intended for those students who have worked hard, despite having some difficulties, and have persevered.
