She was a recipient of the Agnes Myers Washington Post teacher of the year award. Ms. Hall was a dedicated educator and was respected and loved by her students. In her memory, we have established this award for middle school students, since her last assignment was at Mattawoman Middle School.

For: Middle School Students

Nomination Process: Middle School teachers/teams can nominate a middle school student for the **Champion Student Recognition** by completing a nomination form and returning it to the EACC office by 01/29/2016. The included nomination form must be completed by the teacher/team and should list specific reasons for why this student should be recognized as a **Champion Student**. There is no limit of nominees per teacher/team/school.

This award is intended to recognize those students who have worked hard, despite having some difficulties, and have persevered. Please nominate students who have shown improvement in areas such as attendance, good citizenship, excellent effort or other related academic reasons.

The selection process will be made by the EACC Public Relations Committee by March 31, 2016.

Prize: Selected **Champion Students** will receive a certificate of accomplishment, a gift card to a local book store to encourage reading, and recognition at the CCPS Board of Education meeting in April 2016.
